



# Let's Make It!

## Hand Print Gift Wrap

Powdered Tempera paints  
Cake pan  
White butcher or shelf paper

Mix tempera paints with water to the consistency of heavy cream. Pour a small amount into the cake pan; swirl to leave a thin film on the bottom of the pan. Lay your child's hand flat in the pan to pick up paint, then lay hand flat on paper to print. Make random prints on paper.

## Snow Globes

Baby food jars (medium or large jars)  
Florist clay  
Small figurine  
White glitter or fake snow  
Glue gun  
Glue or hot glue  
Optional: any ribbon, garland plastic greenery

Make sure jar is washed and clean. Note: any jar will do if you desire a larger snow globe.

Attach figurine to inside of jar lid using florist clay. If you are using a small object, it's a good idea to build up the clay so the object will appear taller. Attach any optional items with the clay (greenery, berries, etc.). Use your imagination, but make sure it is waterproof and won't dissolve.

Fill jar with water to within 1/2 inch of top. Use cold water as warm water tends to cloud. Sprinkle 1 tablespoon of glitter, or snow into water.

Insert figurine in water, screw on lid. Let stand overnight, lid side up.

Use glue/sealer to ensure that it is waterproof and attach decorative ribbon over lid. You may also paint the lid rather than use ribbon. Use your imagination, the possibilities are endless!

Hints: Make sure the objects are secure in the clay, you could even glue them for added security.

Before gluing or sealing the lid, make sure you have sufficient amount of glitter. Depending on the size of the jar, you may need more or less.



## Gift Tags

Cut out pictures from magazines, cards, etc.  
Card stock paper or unruled index cards  
Glue stick  
White craft glue  
Ribbon or cord  
Craft knife  
Scissors  
Ruler

Cut the card to a suitable shape. If the tag is to be shaped (a Christmas bell, for example), glue all the elements on to the card first, then cut out the shape.

Arrange colored paper, photocopies, magazine pictures or found objects on the card until you achieve the result you want.

Glue the elements to the card. Use the glue stick for paper and white craft glue for sequins, beads or bulky items.

Punch a hole in the top or corner of the tag and attach the ribbon or cord for the tie.
